In order to improve contest participation this year, I have made a few changes to the rules. For one thing, the yearly contests are now mixed mode, so nobody will be forced to work a mode they don't like. Also, there are more of the open contests this year, as end of year tabulations indicated that these were the most popular contests. I hope that all of these changes will be to your liking. However, I would like to get some feedback from as many of you as possible before they are "cast in concrete". Therefore, I have included a copy of the proposed rules in this bulletin for you to review and, hopefully, make comments.

PLEASE DO NOT GIVE ME THESE COMMENTS ON THE PHONE OR AT THE MEETING!! In order to fairly consider all of your comments, I am requesting that they be submitted BY MAIL on 8½ x 11 paper and be either typed or clearly written and be mailed no later than Feb. 15, 1982. If you didn't enter any of the contests last year, please tell me what you didn't like about them. If you did, suggest some improvements. Please take the time to do this. These are your contests and I sincerely would like to make them what you want. Thank you.

P R O P O S E D

1982 SOUTHEASTERN DX CLUB AWARDS and CONTEST PROGRAM

A. THE HELPING HAND AWARD

The helping hand award is offered to provide an incentive to those who help other members work new countries. The award is offered to any and all SEDXC members who accumulate one hundred or more helping hand points during the contest year. A point is earned by calling and actually speaking to another club member at a local telephone number or on 2-meters to alert him of a country which he needs according to the SEDXC listing. Bonus points are added for calling long distance making the number of points for such a call 2-points instead of one. The contest period runs from March 1 through November 30.

B. MONTHLY SEDXC CONTESTS

There will be nine monthly contests this year. The winner of each will receive a handsome plaque at the next club meeting following the contest. A member will be permitted to win only one monthly contest in 1982, but is encouraged to continue to submit scores for the other monthly contests in order to compete in the "OVERALL WINNER" competition. No multi-op entries or out-of-country entries will be permitted, however operators in state-side multi-op operations will be permitted to claim their contacts for the club competition. The monthly contests for 1982 are:

All scores equal the number of DXCC countries worked during the contest period. Entries must be submitted by mail on form attached to rules and postmarked no later than the fifteenth day of the month following the contest. Submit all entries to: John O. Battles, P.O. Box 96, Norcross, GA 30091.

C. YEARLY CONTESTS

The yearly contests will run from March 1 through November 30 and will be awarded to the six SEDXC members accumulating the greatest number of DXCC countries on each of the high frequency amateur bands respectively. These contests will be mixed mode, that is countries may be worked on any mode or on mixed modes, but each country counts only once. Entries MUST be submitted by mail on the attached entry form and must be postmarked no later than Dec. 1, 1982. Submit all entries to: John O. Battle, P.O. Box 96, Norcross, GA 30091. It should be noted that a member may win both a yearly contest and a monthly contest, but only one of each. Participants entering more than one yearly contest should clearly state their preferences.

D. OVERALL WINNER AWARDS

At the discretion of the executive committee, overall winner plaques may be awarded in each of the above categories. The general criteria will be that, in the opinion of the committee, an outstanding effort has been made by the participant and that he/she has the highest total score for the category in question. Score for the monthly and yearly contests will be determined as follows: the winner of each contest will be accredited with a number of overall winner points equal to the number of entrants in that contest. The first runner-up receives one less and so on with the last place receiving one point. The total score is simply the sum of these scores.
